After earlier announcing that the right-wing march would simply be rerouted, Chandler banned it altogether. Furious at the decision, neo-Nazi thugs took to the streets where they came face to face with gangs of young Asian troublemakers. Chandler sent in the Territorial Support Group to quell the unrest and a tempo-



rary peace was restored. But while most of the Relief relaxed, PC Des Taviner had pressing matters to attend to. With no ready to put in Conway's collection, Taviner had confiscated £200 of drug money from a young suspect, not knowing that the notes were forgeries. When he found out the awful truth, he knew he had to destroy the evidence that was sitting in Inspector Monroe's office. After failing to break in to the office, he spotted a thug climbing over the wall of the station.
